- CPA managing Marina project & is in the bidding process

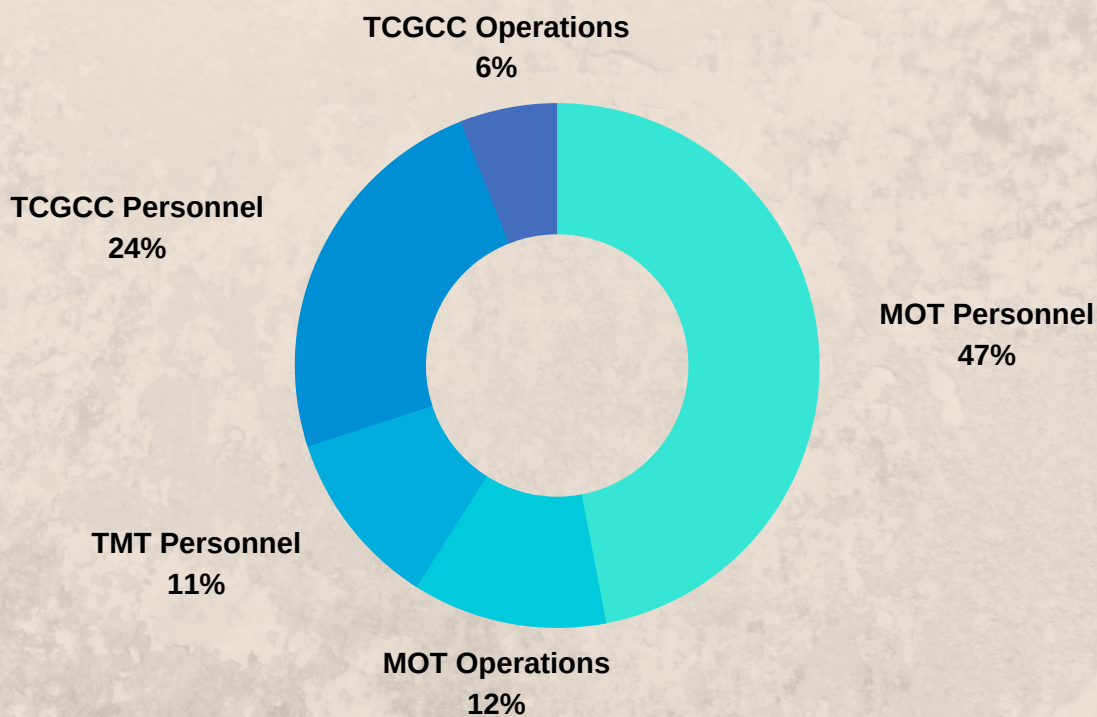
- Assigned an A&E firm to begin working on the Social Hall project

## REVENUE & EXPENSES:

Provided by law, the Office of the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan's fiscal budget includes appropriations from the general and local funds. These appropriations pay for the personnel and fringe benefits, travel, equipment, supplies (office & operations), contracts, office space rental, construction, lease vehicles, utilities, fuel and lubrication, official representation, licenses, and other fees. Other sources of revenue are sought through federal grants and revenue-generating divisions within the Tinian Mayor's Office.
